





Norwich and York: a comparison of two historical cities and the surrounding areas

History

- Research the Vikings and their way of life.
- Learn about how and where the Vikings settled in York
- Create a timeline mapping key events in York and Norwich's history
- Compare York Minster and castle with Norwich Cathedral and castle
- Research significant figures in the city's history: who was Robert Kett and who was Guy Fawkes

Create a brochure/guide to one of the cathedrals or castles in Norwich or York.

Interview Robert Kett or Guy Fawkes and write a news feature about them.

Geography

- Draw a map of Norwich and York cities and include key geographical and historical features
- Study the Norfolk coastline – how has it been affected by erosion?
- What is erosion and disposition? What are the features of a river?
- The Norwich and York chocolate trade – identify where the cocoa bean comes from and the journey it makes across the world.

Write an information text about the river Yare.

Create a first person recount from a cocoa bean's pov detailing its journey from plant to chocolate bar.


Design a new training facility for Norwich City FC. You will decide on how the players exercise and what they eat. You will design a new football kit and stadium to play in.
